FOUR TO-DOS FOR APOLOGETICS

1. Start with prayer

[1 Corinthians 2:12-14, VOICE]

*Our collective judgment on spiritual matters is accessible to those who have the Spirit. But a person who denies spiritual realities will not accept the things that come through the Spirit of God; they all sound like foolishness to him. **He is incapable of grasping them** because they are disseminated and discerned only through the Spirit.*

[Acts 17:2-3]

*As was his custom, Paul went into the synagogue and reasoned (argued and debated) with them from the Scriptures, **explaining and proving that the Messiah had to suffer and rise from the dead.** "This Jesus I am proclaiming to you is the Messiah."*

2. Do your homework

[2 Timothy 2:15]

Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved, a worker who does not need to be ashamed and who correctly handles the word of truth.

[John 6:47]
