Blessing Is God's Favor

God's favor finds you.

- 2. Why is it that generosity does not come naturally to human beings?
- 3. How can generosity touch our emotions and memories? How has that impacted you in the past?
- 4. Of your time, talents, and treasure, which do you like to give the most? Which is the easiest for you to receive?
- 5. Where, in your current sphere of influence, are you best positioned for Irrational Generosity? What would a practical step look like?
- 6. How has God's generosity in sending His Son affected the generations in your family? (grace, forgiveness, healing, purpose...)
- 7. What's one way that you can be Irrationally Generous to Jesus this week?
