While the questions are important, remember your group's goal is not to get through the
questions, but to create an atmosphere that will foster true friendships.
Use the discussion questions as you see fit but emphasize the relationships.

[1 Samuel 16:1]

The Lord said to Samuel, “How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and be on your way; I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem. I have chosen one of his sons to be king.”

Anointing /Grk. *Chrisma* = divine enablement, God's presence and power coming upon us to do and accomplish what we could never do without the Person and power of the Holy Spirit
(1 John 2:27, Acts 1:8)

[1 Samuel 16:13]

So as David stood there among his brothers, Samuel took the flask of olive oil he had brought and anointed David with the oil. And the Spirit of the Lord came powerfully upon David from that day on

[Acts 1:8]

“you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you”

1. **WE need the anointing of the prophet to speak the word of God into your world.**

2. **WE need the anointing of the priest to minister to people...**

[2 Corinthians 3:6, NIV]

⁶He has made us competent as ministers of a new covenant—not of the letter but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

3. **We need the anointing of the king to rule and reign in this life!**

[Revelation 1:6]

and to the one who has made us to rule as a kingly priesthood to serve his God and Father—to him be glory and power for ever and ever! Amen.

[Psalm 119:33, 35, TPT, NLT]

***33** Give me revelation about the meaning of your ways so I can enjoy the reward of following them fully...*

***35** Make me walk along the path of your commands, for that is where my happiness is found.*

The Anointing teaches us (The Spirit reveals the Truth of the Word)

[1 Corinthians 2:10-12, 16, NLT]

***10** But it was to us that God revealed these things by his Spirit. For his Spirit searches out everything and shows us God's deep*

secrets. 11 No one can know a person's thoughts except that person's own spirit, and no one can know God's thoughts except God's own Spirit. 12 And we have received God's Spirit (not the world's spirit), so we can know the wonderful things God has freely given us... 16 For,
"Who can know the Lord's thoughts?
Who knows enough to teach him?"
But we understand these things, for we have the mind of Christ.

[1 John 2:20, AMP

20 But you have an anointing from the Holy One [you have been set apart, specially gifted and prepared by the Holy Spirit], and all of you know [the truth because He teaches us, illuminates our minds, and guards us from error].

[Psalm 25:5, ESV]

5 Lead me in your truth and teach me,
for you are the God of my salvation;
for you I wait all the day long.

FOR MONDAY—

Schedule time each day to wait on God and let Him "teach you His paths":

- Read and pray Scripture (start with Psalms)
- Ask Him to speak into your life
- Be quiet and listen

[Isaiah 10:27, NKJV]

27 It shall come to pass in that day
That his burden will be taken away from your shoulder,
And his yoke from your neck,
And the yoke will be destroyed because of the anointing oil.

The Anointing breaks the yoke (The Spirit breaks off what holds us back)

[Luke 11:13, TPT]

13 If imperfect parents know how to lovingly take care of their children and give them what they need, how much more will the perfect heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit's fullness when his children ask him.

TALK IT THROUGH

1. What are some everyday purposes for oil? What are sacred uses of it?
2. "God wants to anoint you for some new stuff today!"—Pastor Dave; What new stuff do you feel God has for you today?
3. What are some things you **can do without** the anointing? What are the things that you **cannot do without** the anointing?
4. How do you feel about asking for the anointing to help build God's Kingdom, being a bridge for the lost? Do you personally feel you can always ask for more anointing or feel inspired to ask for it for the first time?
5. In what areas of your life do you feel you need the anointing?
6. **Slow down...wait...listen:** Why is this so important to God's anointing? Why is this important at all? What area in your life do you find it difficult to make quality time for God and where do you plan to carve out for time with him?
7. What are some things that are holding you back, and how can you let go of them?
8. Pray for the anointing to teach you and to break any yokes, even this week.
