USING THIS SERMON DISCUSSION GUIDE

We have provided all the Scriptures references in the sermon and some discussion questions for you to use to discuss the weekend message.

This Sermon Discussion Guide is only a tool to aid you in meeting the needs of your group. For most groups, there are too many questions to answer in one session together. Give priority to the needs and pace of your group members.

While the questions are important, remember your group's goal is to create an atmosphere that will foster true friendships. Use the discussion questions as you see fit but emphasize the relationships.

[1 Corinthians 9:24-27]

Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win. Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They then do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. Therefore I run in such a way, as not without aim; I box in such a way, as not beating the air; but I discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified.

There is an urgency to your spiritual journey.

How we "Run to Win"

1. Keep Your Eye on the Prize

[1 Corinthians 9:24-25]

Do you not know that those who run in a race all run, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win. Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They then do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable.

[Philippians 3:13-14, 18-20]

... But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus⁻ For, as I have often told you before and now tell you again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ.

"If what you're running towards is not based on the person of Jesus, you're running for nothing!"

"Does what I'm running for bring glory to my name, or does it bring glory to His name?"

How we "Run to Win"

2. His Word gives me a clear path.

[Psalm 119:24]

Your testimonies are my delight; they are my counselors.

[Proverbs 4:10-12]

Listen, my son, accept what I say, and the years of your life will be many. I instruct you in the way of wisdom and lead you along straight paths. When you walk, your steps will not be hampered; when you run, you will not stumble.

[Proverbs 4:25-26]

Let your eyes look straight ahead; fix your gaze directly before you. Give careful thought to the paths for your feet and be steadfast in all your ways.

[Psalm 119:105]

Your word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path.

The unfolding of your words gives light; it imparts understanding to the simple.

How we "Run to Win"

3. Let the Holy Spirit be your coach

[1 Corinthians 9:25-27]

Everyone who competes in the games exercises self-control in all things. They then do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable. Therefore I run in such a way, as not without aim; I box in such a way, as not beating the air; but I discipline my body and make it my slave (bring my body into subjection).

- Leads me in the truth (John 16:13)
- Gives me strength and endurance (Colossians 1:11)
- Gives me energy (Ephesians 3:20)
