4 Spiritual types of real-estate

1. Egypt = the place of death and bondage

(Deliverance required)

2. The Wilderness = the journey between

(The place of testing, trusting God, separation between the faithful and the disobedient)

- 3. Canaan-the promised land = Living in the place of inheritance / living out our full potential
- 4. Babylon = a returning to bondage and captivity.

[Joshua 1:1-9 NLT]

After the death of Moses the Lord 's servant, the Lord spoke to Joshua son of Nun, Moses' assistant. He said, "Moses my servant is dead. Therefore, the time has come for you to lead these people, the Israelites, across the Jordan River into the land I am giving them. City takers are those who:
